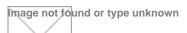

UAA is located in the heart of Alaska's largest city and is the state's largest post-secondary institution. UAA consists of the main campus in Anchorage and community campuses located in the Matanuska Valley, Valdez, Kodiak and the Kenai Peninsula.
